A. Call to Order

Chairman Dannels called the meeting to order at 10:02 a.m. and asked Detective Krajcer to lead everyone in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

B. Introductions, Presentations and Announcements

*Matt Giordano, Executive Director*

- Roll-call was taken. Seven Board members are present; four are here in person and three are participating via telephone/video conferencing. Colonel Glover, Detective Cook, Professor Robinson and Director Thornell are absent.
- The positions of large city and small city Chiefs of Police remain vacant on the Board. The office of Boards and Commissions is aware of these vacancies and we will continue to push for these positions to be filled.
- Diane DeDea, who has been our Independent Legal Advisor for the past year, will be leaving the Attorney General's Office and this is her last meeting. Diane did a great job for us and she will be sorely missed. Her replacement will be Ben Norris. Ben has handled multiple cases for AZPOST in the past and we are very excited to have him join us.

C. Executive Director's Report

- The Legislature is currently on hiatus and they reconvene on Wednesdays to handle some business. They have not started budget discussions yet, but we are hopeful we will receive our normal allocated budget for next year.
- The new on-line reporting system for yearly training audits is working very well. The new system allows us to audit a larger group of officers. We are very excited because this new technology is quicker and more efficient.
- AZPOST is hosting the International Association of Directors of Law Enforcement Standards and Training (IADLEST) annual conference this year in Phoenix. The conference will be held on June 2-5 at the Arizona Grand Resort in Phoenix. All Board members and staff are invited to attend.

D. Consent Agenda

Ms. Weisz made a motion to accept the Consent Agenda. The motion was seconded by Division Chief Mundell and passed unanimously.

- E. Review, Discussion and Possible Action on a Petition from the Sedona Police Department pursuant to A.A.C. R13-4-103(G) for Applicant Raquel Oliver.

Assistant Attorney General Mark Brachtl addressed the Board regarding a Sedona Police Department petition for Applicant Raquel Oliver. Applicant Oliver is not able to pass the Peace Officer Physical Aptitude Test (POPAT) due to a knee injury. Chief Stephanie Foley, Sedona Police Department, addressed the Board to request that the petition be granted.

Ms. Weisz made a motion that based upon the petition submitted by the Sedona Police Department and pursuant to A.A.C. R13-4-103(G), the Board grant a restricted peace officer certification for Lt. Raquel Oliver. This certification restricts Lt. Oliver from being assigned any duty likely to result in the need to apply physical force. The motion was seconded by Detective Krajcer and passed unanimously.

- F. Final Action Cases:

1. 2023-239 – Jesus I. Belloc – AZ Department of Public Safety  
The Board considered comments from Assistant Attorney General Mark Brachtl, attorney for the Arizona Peace Officer Standards and Training Board, who provided a brief overview of the proposed consent agreement. Mr. Edmundo Robaina, attorney representing Mr. Belloc, was available to answer any questions. Ms. Weisz made a motion to accept the proposed consent agreement for an 18-month suspension of Mr. Belloc's peace officer certification. The suspension shall be in effect beginning October 25, 2023, and ending April 25, 2025. The motion was seconded by Mr. Schoch and passed with one nay vote recorded for Division Chief Mundell.
2. 2023-225 – Todd W. Morrow – Scottsdale Police Department  
The Board considered comments from Assistant Attorney General Mark Brachtl, attorney for the Arizona Peace Officer Standards and Training Board, who provided a brief overview of the proposed consent agreement. Mr. Chad Smith, attorney representing Mr. Morrow, also addressed the Board. Detective Krajcer made a motion to accept the

proposed consent agreement for an 18-month suspension of Mr. Morrow's peace officer certification. The suspension shall be in effect beginning November 20, 2023, and ending May 19, 2025. The motion was seconded by Commander Figueroa and passed unanimously.

3. 2022-225 – Anthony E. Kirkland – Maricopa County Sheriff's Office

The Board considered comments from Assistant Attorney General Mark Brachtel, attorney for the Arizona Peace Officer Standards and Training Board, who provided a brief overview of the proposed consent agreement. Ms. Kathryn Baillie, attorney representing Mr. Kirkland, also addressed the Board. Commander Figueroa made a motion to accept the proposed consent agreement for a 24-month suspension of Mr. Kirkland's peace officer certification. The suspension shall be in effect beginning January 7, 2022, and ending January 7, 2024. The motion was seconded by Detective Krajcer and passed unanimously.

G. New Charging Cases:

1. 2023-235 – Adam J. Barzar – Tucson Airport Authority

The Board considered comments from Compliance Specialist Cathy Hawse, who provided a brief overview of the case. Ms. Weisz made a motion to Initiate Proceedings against Mr. Barzar's peace officer certification. The motion was seconded by Division Chief Mundell and passed unanimously.

2. 2023-234 – Nathen S. Truss – AZ Department of Public Safety

The Board considered comments from Compliance Specialist Arlene Heckel, who provided a brief overview of the case. Division Chief Mundell made a motion to Initiate Proceedings to deny peace officer certification to Mr. Truss. The motion was seconded by Detective Krajcer and passed unanimously.

3. 2023-227 – Jeffrey A. Maddux – Glendale Police Department

The Board considered comments from Compliance Specialist Tim Shay, who provided a brief overview of the case. Commander Figueroa made a motion to Initiate Proceedings against Mr. Maddux's peace officer certification. The motion was seconded by Mr. Schoch and passed unanimously.


H. Future Agenda Items

This is not an isolated incident. We have noticed some agencies not recognizing when they should or should not mark "yes" for misconduct.
